It's that time of year again. Mark your calendar. December 12, 2011 for our annual Christmas meeting. For those new members who may not be aware, the December meeting is our annual polluck dinner meeting and collection of food items for the Contra Costa Food Bank. The collection was started 18 years ago by Jim Bufton his first year as membership chair and has been supported by members every year since.

The food bank has seen a huge increase in the number of needy families and individuals, from around 90,000 to over 130,000 receiving emergency food assistance. The average of our contributions for the past five years has been 181 lbs of food. ## **Ann Matthews Remembers**

Remember the old song, Home on the Range?

Oh give me a home, Where the buffalo roam, Where the deer and the antelope play, Where seldom is heard, A discouraging word, and the skies are not cloudy all day.

Well, we saw the antelope play. It happened like this: Our Field trip group had been to Nyssa, OR to their rock show in eastern Oregon.

We camped at the town park and visited the show. They were very friendly folks, led field trips and took us to places like Graveyard Point, Succor Creek and the picture rock claims. They also gave away a Rockhound and Recreational Map by the Chamber of Commerce of Nyssa. We used the map to find some of the areas listed.

Our group chose a place to hunt for rocks, so parked the RVs for the night. The next morning we lined up our Jeeps, (most had Jeeps we towed this trip). Al and Helen Schuyler's kids had painted on the front of their old green jeep, the name, "Grandpa's Rocker". They said every time Al got out of his jeep to look for rocks, he was off his rocker!

The leaders went looking for the right road, or rather trail, leading to a place listed on the map to hunt rocks. While we waited, our kids were watching the ants in a couple of ant hills. These were big ants, not the little ones that get into our houses at home. These ants were all busy coming and going and working hard, some even carrying big bolders. Kids being kids, they stuck a stick in one ant hill and when some ants climbed aboard, they carried it to another ant hill. Big mistake, they started a war! The ants being invadid all came rushing out of the ant hill. The poor innocent ants on the stick were in big trouble.

The leaders came back and led our row of Jeeps down a trail. As we were driving slowly along, in a line, we saw in the distance a herd of antelopes running toward us. 

## **MOROCCAN MINERAL TOUR - 2012**

The rugged and picturesque Anti-Atlas and High-Atlas Mountains of southern Morocco host some of the world's most remarkable mineral deposits. Vanadinite at Mibladen, rare phosphate minerals at the Angarf-Sud pegmatite, a startling array of colorful cobalt minerals in the mines of the Bou Azzer district, and much, much more in the mines of Taouz, Midelt and Bou Skour. Along our route we'll also visit ancient and contemporary cultural sites, enjoy wonderful scenery and participate in unique experiences - anyone for camel riding?

Our high-clearance 4WD vehicles and expert guides will get us to many sights that the average tourist (and mineral collector) can only dream about, and we'll have plenty of opportunities to collect and purchase mineral specimens.

## **CFMS** Director's Meeting

The weather was not as pleasant as in previous year. For many years now we have camped in the back parking lot at the Holiday Inn in Visalia. It rained out the happy hour the Betty and I host at our trailer on Friday afternoon and it was too cold and breezy on Saturday afternoon. We went down on Thursday this year and drove up to Sequoia National Park on Friday morning and stopped at a couple of yard sales on the way back in the early afternoon.

Friday evening there was the Cracker Barrel; an informal get-together for socializing and sharing of ideas. The Directors' meeting was held Saturday morning and concluded at about 12:30. In the afternoon, after a quick lunch, there was the PLAC/ALAA meeting which I was involved with and a roundtable discussion on membership. Saturday evening was the banquet to install the 2011 officers. The meeting concluded Sunday morning with the new president's change over meeting with the other new officers and the committee chairs. A full weekend conducting the business of the Federation.

## Directors' Meeting highlights:

- The meeting was called to order followed by the Pledge to the Flag. I was called upon to give the Invocation and an In Memoriam for recently deceased members. The In Memoriam included Joe Hafeli from the Napa Club who was a past Field Trip leader for the Federation and the example for me of what a field trip leader should be and how to lead field trips.
- ➤ There was a very good turnout of directors. 72 out of approximately 120 societies were represented; there were 5 officers and 22 committee chairs. When a society does not have a director present their society does not have a voice in the business of the Federation.
- The 2011 Show was hosted by Superior Cal G&MA at Anderson, CA (near Redding) on May 13 to 15 at the fairgrounds. They presented the Federation with a check for \$4622 for the Federation's share of the proceeds.
- The 2012 show will be hosted by the Valley Prospectors in Riverside, CA. I have the Show packet with registration, competitive and non-competitive forms and information about the attractions around the area. Contact me for more information and copies of the forms. Betty and I are planning to attend and to exhibit. Attendance and exhibiting is open to all members. If you would like to attend or just want more information please contact me.
- The 2013 show will be co-hosted by 3 societies at the Ventura Fairground. More detail later. The Federation is still looking for societies to host the 2014 show and beyond.
- The officers for 2012 were elected: President Susan Chaisson-Walblom, 1st VP Bud McMillin, 2nd VP Jennifer Haley, Treasurer Tom Burchard, and Secretary Robert Sankovich.
- The 2012 Budget was approved with revenues of approximately \$86,650 and expenses of approximately \$98850. This is a projected loss of \$12,200 which will have to come from the general fund. The loss is due to declining membership and low show profits.
- No change in the dues and insurance for 2012. The per member dues are \$1.25 to the CFMS and \$.75 to the AFMS. The per member insurance is \$6.00. Total due to CFMS is \$8.00 per member.
- All American Club there was only one entry this year. In 2002 and 2004 the CCM&GS prepared an entry book and won gold awards. We haven't entered in recent years. Basically you prepare a "Brag Book"; a scrap book of our societies activities and accomplishments. It is the current history of the CCM&GS. Who would like to serve on the committee to put this book together for 2011? Contact me for more information.
- Mary Ann King is the Cab Cases North representative. She takes and displays the CFMS cab cases to all shows that she attends. Most recently they were at our show. Did you see them?

- Earth Science Studies. The one week Camp Zyzzx is scheduled for April 1-7, 2012. The cost will be \$375 for room, meals and most class supplies. See me for more information and application forms.
- Education Through Sharing. Only 8 societies recognized one of their members with this honor this year. CCM&GS was one of the 8 societies. Come to our Holiday Party in December to learn who this honored person is.
- ➤ The Endowment Fund will again conduct a raffle for 2 one week sessions at Camp Paradise in September of 2012. I will have raffle ticks at our meetings next spring.
- ➤ Colleen McGann is the CFMS Representative to the AFMS Endowment Fund Committee. She is soliciting donations from CFMS artisans and members for raffle prices. I will have raffle ticket for sale next spring. Drawing is held at the AFMS Show in July.
- The AFMS is supporting and promoting a series of commemorative US stamps with Birthstones, and is asking for support from the regional Federations and their clubs (us.)
- There were no nominations from the societies for CFMS Scholarship Honorees therefore no scholarships will be awarded for 2011. This is a great shame and a great loss the some deserving students.
- Museum Com.: Debbie Bunn has completed the inventory of the Federation's museum property unique minerals, fossils, specimens, petrified wood and jewelry.
- I turned in a BIG bundle of stamps to Debbie Bunn who collects them for the Easter Seals Society in the name of CFMS. Thanks to all of you that saved and gave me stamps over the past year. Saving stamps has been an ongoing project of the Federation, which is a moneymaker for the Easter Seal Society. It is easy to help; just cut any and all stamps from you mail, put them in an envelope or zip lock bag and give them to me. I will turn them in at Federation meetings.
- The North Bay Field Trips (we are members) donated \$375.00 to each of the AFMS and CFMS Endowment Funds and Scholarship Funds.
- There will be only one CFMS scholarship awarded this year because only one society nominated an honoree. There are sufficient funds for more scholarships but they can only be given out by an honoree nominated by a CFMS society. The CCM&GS may nominate an honoree to recognize the service of one of our members to education.

If you are interested I have the complete meeting packet that has the agenda, minutes of the May 2011 meeting, committee reports, Treasurer's report and other Federation business. I will have it available at the next few Board meetings and general membership meetings.

The joint meeting of PLAC committee and ALAA was held following the Directors' meeting on Saturday. The meeting was open to everyone who is interested in and uses our public lands. We had very good attendance. Over 30 people attended including 7 officers and directors of ALAA attended. The Field Rep for Congressman Devin Nunes of the 21st District (Visalia) talked about 3 bills currently before the House:

H.R.1581 Wilderness Study Area and Roadless Release Act of 2011

H.R.758 National Monument Designation Accountability and Transparency Act of 2011

H.R.1996 Government Litigation Savings Act of 2011.

These three Bills are of great interest to our members and great importance to how we conduct our activities and our hobby. Amy Granat gave information about a laws suit that is being filed against the USFS concerning access and use by the elderly and disabled. This deals with road use and will affect all of us. This suit will affect how all Land Use Plans and Travel plans are developed and written for all USFS and BLM land.
