

Balmorhea Blue Agate

The agate fields around Balmorhea Lake is well known to the collectors for their strong blue colored agates as well as black plume agates and the classic example would be one with strong white and blue color combos. Lake Balmorhea is mainly a fishing site and also a great birding site where many migrating birds stop by to rest. The flat areas to the south of the lake will produce bleached agate fragments and it's possible to find larger fragments and the washes are best places to look for the agates. Some agates are also found in the hills on the northern side of the lake. Alan and I did not have a much of luck anywhere around the lake but received directions from a local rock shop owner and were able to find quite a few agates on the north side of the town of Balmorhea. Some people have also found calcite with plume inclusions which would indicate that the plume material formed independently of the agate formation.

Since the area around the lake is a private land that is open to recreation including rock-collecting, at the time we went there anyone wishing to try their luck at finding any agates must stop by the fishing store to pay a small fee before venturing out around the lake. Take a route toward the Lake Balmorhea and keep going till you see the white fishing store on the right side.

One author I read expressed the possibility that the agates of Balmorhea might share the same basaltic volcano systems as those of Marfa agates since they show similar colors.

Balmorhea is famous for their blue agate, banded often with black plumes. The skin is usually black with a white patina on the surface. It appears to be fairly wide spread in isolated pockets northwest of the Davis Mountains. The Blue Agate Rock and Gift shop in Fort Davis has a nice collection (432.426.2924)

The collecting areas is the north east area around Lake Balmorhea. In Balmorhea, TX, which is about 25 miles north of Fort Davis off of Hwy 118 and just south of I-10, find Houston Street. It will be marked with a sign pointing the direction to the lake. Follow Houston to the lake and be sure to pay a daily use park fee at the park store.
