Kelly Plumb assembled and submitted our club entry into the CFMS




We need a couple of members to help with our required 5-year review of the by-laws. Please talk to me if you can help with this important task.

The big excitement in the next two months is the Antioch Lapidary Club show right around the corner on February 17th and 18th at the Contra Costa Fairgrounds, 1201 West 10th street in Antioch CA. # Show Your Stuff! Get Fame and Glory!

How You Can Create a Display Case That Gets Attention and Flaunts Your Skills!

You've undoubtedly noticed the display cases at our show and others that hold an array of fascinating exhibits on an endless range of topics related to our hobby. They help us fulfill part of our educational commitment as an organization, they also allow us to show off how we learn about minerals and gems, take field trips, do crafts related to our hobby and so much more.

If you haven't created a case lately or think the one you have could benefit from updating you'll find winter is a great time to come up with new ideas and execute them. You can do one alone or as a group project. It's a great way to be hands-on with your hobby and have a new display for our show. More details later in this article.

A growing number of our members are also showing their cases at other shows and competing for prizes, both of which help promote CCM&GS.



Wider exposure for your case means you get to spend more time seeing other people's cases and talking with them about their clubs and activities. For example, here are two shows you should know about:

1. The Alameda County Fair has a competition (sign up at <a href="https://alamed.fairwire.com/">https://alamed.fairwire.com/</a> Your case will be on display from set-up June 7-10 to teardown, July 9. You will receive a free ticket to attend the fair and may win a ribbon up to the big gold ribbon for Judge's Favorite. Entry Deadline is May 15.

Here is what you will need to answer when you register:

Collections: Gems & Minerals, Jewelry, and Woodworking

Division: Gems & Minerals (adults)

Class: There are eight choices here including Mixed Lapidary, Novelties, Geodes, Education, and Fair Theme (this year it is 'That Summer Feeling', perfect for shell or beach glass collections). Pick the Class that most closely fits your case,

Title: Of your case

Description: A sentence or two that tells what your case is about. For example, "Cabochons I made with Minerals I collected in Contra Costa County."


