
trailer at 8:30! Everyone did an amazing job to get this accomplished. We were successful because of all of you! THANK YOU ALL!!!!



Suspects in Mariposa museum theft plead not guilty

Three of the four suspects charged in connection with a brazen heist of gold and gems from a state museum in the Sierra foothills have pleaded not guilty to robbery and other charges on Monday.

The fourth man charged, did not enter a plea. He was ordered to return to court today. Prosecutors say during the Sept. 28 robbery of the California State Mining and Mineral Museum in Mariposa the four men made off with \$1.3 million worth of gold, gems and artifacts.

Investigators say some of the stolen loot has been recovered, but have not said how much. The suspects are being held on \$1 million bail.

CFMS Director's Meeting

For about 20 years now Betty and I have camped in the back parking lot at the Holiday Inn in Visalia for the weekend of the Directors' meeting. There used to be 10 to 15 rigs for this weekend. This year there was one other camper. It was too cold and breezy for a happy hour on Friday but about a half a dozen people joined us on Saturday evening before the banquet.

Friday afternoon was the Executive Committee meeting; in the evening there was the Cracker Barrel which is an informal get-together for socializing and sharing of ideas. The Directors' meeting was held Saturday morning and concluded at about 1:30. Saturday evening was the banquet to install the 2013 officers. The meeting concluded Sunday morning with the new president's change over meeting with the other new officers and the committee chairs. A full weekend conducting the business of the Federation.

Directors' Meeting highlights:

- The meeting was called to order followed by the Pledge to the Flag. I was called upon to give the Invocation and an In Memoriam for recently deceased members.
- There was a very good turnout of directors. 61 directors representing approximately 114 societies; there were 5 officers and 26 committee chairs. When a society does not have a director present their society does not have a voice in the business of the Federation.
- The CFMS lost 2 more societies this past 6 months: the Willits G&MS, and the Superior California Association disbanded. One new society was accepted by the CFMS; the Gold Country Treasure Seekers from Placerville.
- The 2012 Show was hosted by the Valley Prospectors in Riverside, CA. They presented the Federation with a check for \$921 for the Federation's share of the proceeds. While this was a very good show and convention it was not as profitable as other recent shows.
- The 2013 show will be co-hosted by 3 Ventura area societies at the Ventura Fairground on May 30 and June 2 & 3. I have the Show packet with registration, competitive and non-competitive forms and information about the attractions around the area. Contact me for more information and copies of the forms. Betty and I are planning to attend and to exhibit. Attendance and exhibiting is open to all members. If you would like to attend or just want more information please contact me.
- The Federation is still looking for societies to host the 2014 show and beyond. Fortunately 4 societies have asked for additional information and hopefully one or more will host a future show.
- The officers for 2013 were elected: President Bud McMillin, 1st VP Jennifer Haley, 2nd VP Tom Burchard, and Secretary Robert Sankovich and Treasurer Margaret Kolaczyk.
- ➤ The 2013 Budget was approved with revenues of approximately \$91,150 and expenses of approximately \$96,150. This is a projected loss of \$5,000 which will have to come from the general fund and is less than other recent budget short fall. The loss is due to declining membership and low show profits.

- No change in the dues and insurance for 2013. The dues are \$1.25 to the CFMS and \$.75 to the AFMS per member. The insurance is \$6.00. Total due to CFMS is \$8.00 per member which is the same for the last few years.
- All American Club there were 3 entries this year. The due date for the 2012 entries is February 28, 2013. It is basically too late for us to put together a book for 2012 but it is the perfect time to start planning for a 2013 submission. Basically you prepare a "Brag Book"; a scrap book of our society's activities and accomplishments following an entry form detailing the requirements. It is the current history of the your society. Who would like to serve on the committee to put this book together for CCM&GS for 2013? Contact me for more information.
- ▶ June Harris accepted the position as Bulletin Aids Chair at the last minute. She already has the 2012 Bulletin Contest forms on the CFMS web site.
- Mary Ann King is the Cab Cases North representative. She took and displayed the CFMS cab cases to a total of 19 shows. Most recently they were at our show. Did you see them?
- Earth Science Studies. The one week Camp Zyzzx is scheduled for March 31 to April 7. The cost will be \$375 for room, meals and most class supplies. If you use your own RV there is a \$50/person discount. See me for more information and application forms.
- Education Through Sharing. Only 8 societies recognized one of their members with this honor this year. CCM&GS was one of the 8 societies. Come to our Holiday Party in December to learn who this honored person is.
- ➤ I turned in \$65.20, the equivalent of 1305 nickels, to the Endowment Fund's Half Million Nickel Collection. A couple of societies did collect several hundreds of dollars but most collections were in the \$40 to \$80 range. A final report will be in the CFMS Newsletter.
- Colleen McGann is the CFMS Representative to the AFMS Endowment Fund Committee. She is soliciting donations from CFMS artisans and members for raffle prices. I will have raffle ticket for sale next spring. Drawing is held at the AFMS Show in September.
- There were nominations from the societies for CFMS Scholarship Honorees therefore 3 CFMS scholarships will be awarded for 2013 and one Diedrick Scholarship. There are sufficient funds for scholarships but they can only be given out by an honoree nominated by a CFMS society. The CCM&GS may nominate an honoree to recognize the service of one of our members to education.
- Membership in the CFMS is declining, both societies and individuals. In 2000 there were approximately 150 societies with 11043 individuals. Now in 2012 there are 114 societies with only 9254 individuals. A few societies are growing, many are stable/stagnant and more than a few are made up of elderly people and have a dim future for surviving. A society grows and prospers through involved members that participate in the operation of the society (holds an office or is on a committee) and attends

meetings, shows and functions. Are you contributing to the survival and growth of CCM&GS?

- Museum Com.: Debbie Bunn has completed the inventory of the Federation's museum property unique minerals, fossils, specimens, petrified wood and jewelry.
- I turned in a BIG bundle of stamps to Debbie Bunn who collects them for the Easter Seals Society in the name of CFMS. Thanks to all of you that saved and gave me stamps over the past year. Saving stamps has been an ongoing project of the Federation, which is a moneymaker for the Easter Seal Society. It is easy to help; just cut any and all stamps from you mail, put them in an envelope or zip lock bag and give them to me. I will turn them in at Federation meetings.
- ▶ Betty reported that there were only 4 donations to the AFMS Scholarship Fund since June. Donations are way down.
- The Junior Rockhounds of America is a program sponsored and fully funded by the AFMS. Five new badges were added this year for a total of 20 badges that can be earned. This badge program is similar to the scouts program.

If you want to know about the CFMS and this recent directors meeting I have the complete meeting packet that has the agenda, minutes of the May 2011 meeting, committee reports, Treasurer's report and other Federation business. I will have it available at the next few Board meetings and general membership meetings.

Time to take a breather. We've finished our classes for 2012 and they were great! We had field trip etiquette, mineral identification, silver work, creating beaded cabochon pendants and many, many more.

We're hoping to offer a class on how to use a dremel in March, so keep an eye out! What class would you like to take? Let me know and I'll try to find a great teacher and set it up!
