BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

March 4, 2019 6:35pm

The Board of Directors meeting was held at Round Table Pizza in Pleasant Hill. Present: Bonnie Eichler, Chuck Olson, Mary Jernigan, Mary Hanjes, Dick Pankey, Paul Black, Kelly Plumb, Mike Hopkins. Terry Caskey and member- Taylor Thompson. Previous BOD meeting minutes January and February 2019 were reviewed. January BOD minutes were reviewed with no corrections requested. Kelly moved to approve the January minutes as written. Chuck seconded. Vote was taken and accepted. February BOD minutes were reviewed with no corrections requested. Mary J. moved to approve the February minutes as written. Kelly seconded. Vote was taken and accepted. Bills for reimbursement were submitted to Secretary- Mary Hanjes. March Newsletter notification was emailed to members by Publicity/Show Chairperson- Mike Hopkins. Some members were unable to open the newsletter document in docx. Mike will ask Editor- Johanna for a Word doc copy in the future. President-Bonnie Eichler reviewed the request and BOD approval to purchase 5 shelves for the new storage room with the maximum amount to be \$500. Request and approvals were emailed to the BOD. Bylaws change suggestions were discussed. Notations for membership badges to be charged as per current cost. Members had only been charged \$5 for the badges when actual cost to make the badges were \$9-\$10 each. CCM&GS has been paying the difference in the badge costs. Suggestions for proposed Bylaws changes to be sent to Bonnie by 3/16 for combining information. Bonnie is also in the process of reworking and updating the verbiage on the membership application. Any recommended changes/additions to the membership application to be emailed to Bonnie. Second Vice President/Fieldtrips- Chuck Olson is brainstorming with others for fieldtrip ideas. Several fieldtrip ideas were offered by BOD. Chuck mentioned that he was checking into joining possible fieldtrips with the Antioch Lapidary Club. Ideas for increasing membership and club publicity included posting information in libraries, school campuses, local media sources (Next Door, Pioneer, Claycord, Community Focus). Show Publicity- Mike Hopkins has 2019 Show flyers printed for members to distribute at upcoming Rock Club shows. Mike presented an updated list of places where he has published CCMG&G Club and Show information including several media sites. Great job, Mike!

Annual Show- BOD discussed sorting through existing rocks with Cheri Elliott and others. Silent Auction needs rock donations for the 2019 Show, President-Bonnie Eichler noted to the Board of Directors positions that remain open: Ecology/Public Lands, Education and Historian, Property Chair- Terry Caskey discussed the current Club storage units and items to be stored. Terry purchased shelves on sale at Lowes for the Concord Storage unit. This was the reason for the expedited emails requesting BOD approval for the shelves purchase. There is a need to purchase clear tubs with lids to store the items instead of cardboard boxes. Tubs will be stored on the shelves. Rocks may be kept in small boxes and buckets. Old shelving will be moved from the Martinez storage unit. Treasurer- Mary Hanjes motioned to allocate \$300 for Terry to purchase totes for storage. Kelly seconded. Vote was taken and motion approved. Show Chairman- Mike Hopkins reminded the BOD that next Show meeting would be on 3/11 before the General meeting. Treasurer- Mary Hanjes informed the BOD that the CCM&GS financial audit was completed on 2/15/19 with the assistance of CCM&GS members Shannon and Dick Merrill. "All records examined were complete, accurate and consistently well presented." Thank you Shannon and Dick for your service! Property Chairperson-Terry Caskey recommended new Show Dealers for the BOD to consider. Terry will be working with Paul Black about the Dealers for our 2019 Show, Paul plans on moving out of California during the Springtime, Thank you, Terry for accepting the task of coordinating the Dealers! BOD meeting adjourned 8:39pm.


