# Oceanview Mine Famous Minerals & Gems - Right Here in California

The Pala Mining District of San Diego County continues to set a standard for world-class minerals & gems of a pegmatite origin. The Oceanview Mine on Chief Mountains is second to none. Presently, you can even "dig your own" gems in their public hosted areas.



We will first review what a pegmatite deposit is, and then watch a video. Mark Mauthner is featured in a video recently recorded at the American Gem Trade Association Show in Tucson. Mark spent a number of years working at the Oceanview Mine as a miner, photographer, and sales manager, and his talk describes the history, geology, and mineral discoveries at the mine.





Here is a partial list for minerals & gems you should bring: Beryl (Morganite, Aquamarine, Goshenite), Mica (Lepidolite, Muscovite), Tourmaline (Elbaite, Schorl), Spodumene (Kunzite), Microcline, Quartz.

Ve are currently looking for classes to fill our calendar for 2017. 
