

Upcoming shapes are: July: free-form, August: triangle, September: no competition.


Left: June's shape of the month (pear) entries.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes June 3, 2019

The Board of Directors meeting was held at Round Table Pizza in Pleasant Hill. Present: Bonnie Eichler, Donna Albrecht, Chuck Olson, Mary Hanjes, Mary Jernigan, Dick Pankey, Mike Hopkins, Kelly Plumb, Terry Caskey. The May BOD minutes were reviewed with corrections to be made.

Corrections to be made in BOD minutes adding verbiage "proposed revised Bylaws for CCM&GS."

Mary Jemigan moved to accept minutes as corrected. Dick Pankey seconded. Vote taken and May BOD minutes accepted as corrected.

At the June 10th General Meeting, an important Membership vote will be taken to accept the proposed revised CCM&GS Bylaws. To constitute a quorum, twenty-five percent of the CCM&GS voting members are to be present at the Educational (General) meeting to vote. An affirmative vote by two-thirds (2/3) majority of the votes cast are required to accept the Bylaws revisions. Mary Jernigan- Membership and Kelly Plumb- Hospitality will be contacting members to please attend the June 10th General Meeting. Mary will also send out an email reminder to the CCM&GS Membership.

There was discussion about ways to increase Membership numbers and Membership involvement.

Reimbursement requests submitted to Mary Hanjes- Treasurer. Mary has made payment to Centre Concord for the CCM&GS General Meetings monthly room rental through 2019. Club Library- more books and bookcase have been taken to Club storage unit. Nominating Committee needs to be formed to recommend member candidates for the 2020 Board of Directors. Other Committee positions will also need to be filled. Mary Jernigan- Secretary distributed Club mail. Reimbursement check \$225 from old storage unit was deposited. Vendor checks were deposited. Club Trailer storage has increased \$5 to \$80 month. Bonnie Eichler- President moved to authorize new pay-
