I wish everyone a safe, happy new year!



BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

December 2, 2018 CCMandGS Board of Director Meeting

The meeting was held at Mt. Mikes Pizza on Clayton Road, Concord. Present: Librarian, President, President Elect, Federation Director and spouse, Treasurer, Field Trip VP, Program VP, Secretary, Membership, Editor/Webpage, a member. Due to the failure to have a quorum at the September BOD meeting the minutes for the August BOD meeting were not voted on. The August BOD minutes were read and approved with the following changes, Dave will "send" to mail "in" information. The Treasurer moved approval and VP of Field Trips seconded, all ayes. Correspondence, a member mailed her dues. Vallejo Gem and Mineral club sent announcement of their Feb 23-24, 2019 show. A Xmas card for a longtime member for signatures. The Treasurer requested all bills be submitted. VP of Field Trips mentioned Quartzsite, see newsletter for information. Membership had a membership application for a family. Seconded by Treasurer, all ayes. Federation meeting is in March at Pomona, the Director may not be going. The VP of Programs said the December meeting will be a Holiday Celebration. Website and Editor thanked those who responded to her request about the Website basics. She mentioned a page for meeting, activities and show information. How about links like to California Federation of Mineralogical Societies (CFMS). The show is always the first full weekend in November, that will be 2nd and 3rd, with setup on Friday the 1st. Please send information for the programs and any graphics as soon as possible. Caution about protecting all members privacy by not including contact information in the newsletter or on the Website was affirmed. Use positions, such as Treasurer or Membership rather than names. Also, pictures of members should be approved prior to being published. The meeting was complicated by the noise in the pizza parlor. We did not arrange early enough to get the meeting room. The Editor requests someone or several volunteers to proof read her work. This help will also make sure that improper member information about members not slip through to the final newsletter. She got ap-

proval for \$70 /year for the Microsoft Editor program. Membership moved that up to \$100 for approval and VP of Programs seconded it. All ayes. Also, there will be an annual Website update low cost. It was stated that only about 15 hardcopies of the newsletter is mailed. There will be an increase in postage cost in January. New members can only get emailed newsletters. The Historian is supposed to keep a hardcopy in the clubs archived records. The Hospitality position is in the Bylaws not the Refreshment position, this person reports to the Hospitality person. The drop-dead due date for the newsletter is the 18th, items not received timely can be delayed until the next month's newsletter. What about Publicity? Membership has the membership email list and addresses and phone numbers. Membership will do the next newsletter distribution. VP of Programs asks for a PC for Programs. Sources of discount prices were discussed. The Editor/Web Master moved to put money in the budget for a PC for programs, Librarian 2nd, all Ayes. Old Business. Membership asked for the minutes to show that the Lighthouse was withdrawn as a Raffle item on the Thursday before the show. It is Budget time. Provide the Treasurer with your budget for 2019 now, she will help you with it if you need. A draft can then be reviewed at the next BOD meeting. As the person elected to be the 2019 Secretary quit in November after the elections, the club needs a Secretary. Membership is volunteering for a short time. Federation Director recommends all BOD members read their duties in the Bylaws for themselves and for others, so all know who is supposed to do what. Librarian called for adjournment at 7:15 pm, VP of Programs 2nd, all ayes. A birthday cake for a member was enjoyed.

Geologist Dave Kleesattel Was Seriously Rockin' in Alaska's 7.0 Magnitude Earthquake!!

CCM&GS member and geologist, Dave Kleesattel (right) was in Anchorage on 11/30/18 when Alaska's 7.0 magnitude earthquake rocked Anchorage area!! Shaking from the earthquake was felt 400 miles away from the Anchorage epicenter. More than six aftershocks greater than 5.0 occurred within hours after the initial 7.0 earthquake. Since roadways were damaged and the Anchorage airport was a disaster, Dave stayed overnight at the "Historic Anchorage Hotel", Anchorage's oldest hotel built in 1916. The hotel had survived the 1964 earthquake of 9.2 magnitude. Eventually Dave was able to charter a small prop plane to his Alaskan home 60 miles away. Stay tuned for future Adventures with Geologist Dave.

Anchorage's earthquake involved "normal faulting" one tectonic plate sliding down the other plate, typically at more than a 50 degree angle. The faulting occurred 30 miles below the surface causing extensive damage to roadways and buildings. (see aerial photo)
