

North Bay Field Trip Association

September 22, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 9:35 am by Dick Pankey. The Pledge of Allegiance was said. Dick recognized the members of the Contra Costa Mineral & Gem Society (CCMGS) for helping setup the room for the meeting-Dick Pankey, Chuck Olson, Mary Hicks, Joanne Caskey, Mary Jernigan, Taylor Thompson, and Louise Gilley. Betty Pankey, Secretary and Treasurer, was absent as she is recovering from heart bypass surgery. Mary Hicks volunteered to take the minutes.

Roll Call: The following Officers and Directors were present: Richard Pankey (President). No other Officers or Directors were present. The turn out for this meeting was less than expected, Dick did not hear from clubs that did not send representatives. Clubs that sent representatives were: Santa Cruz (Dave Duncan, Joanne Meyer), Santa Clara Valley G&MS (John Bahr, Larry Moore), Santa Cruz, Vallejo (Sabrina Rudkin, Lewis Ballentine), Antioch Lapidary Club (Rita), Contra Costa M&GS (Dick Pankey, Chuck Olson). Clubs that did not attend: Lodi, Livermore, San Francisco, Mendocino Coast, Castro Valley, Sequoia and Garage Grinders. Spring meeting minutes: the Spring 2018 meeting minutes were handed out but were not discussed. The review and approval of the minutes is moved to the Fall 2018 meeting.

Treasurer's report: The report was handed out. The beginning balance on April 12, 2018 was \$676.10. The ending balance as of September 20, 2018 was \$621.14. The report states that the following clubs paid the NBFT dues for 2018. Santa Cruz, Antioch Lapidary Club, CCM&GS, Santa Clara, Garage Grinders, Vallejo, Sequoia, Livermore and Peninsula. Clubs that owe their dues: Salinas, Castro Valley, Lodi, San Francisco and Mendocino Coast.

st Field Trips: There have been sparse reports of Field Trips earlier this year. We discussed April thru September. No reports for April. In May the Antioch Lapidary Club had a rock swap on the 19th. For June, Chuck Olson reported mid-month the Lodi Club met at McDermitt, Hwy 395 near the California Oregon borders for thunder eggs. They visited a rock shop that had material in various colors for \$5/pound. They did find a hill top that was paved with walnut size thundereggs. The café food was not very good so if you go to this area bring food. Larry Moore added information about West Coast Mining and others going together on collecting areas and may begin having fee digs like Richardson in Oregon. The poke dot material is closed at this time by West Coast Mining. Dick Pankey reported they had a Silver Pick Field trip to his home. He had a lot of interest. July, CFMS and CCMGS had a field trip to the Davis/Lassen Creek Obsidian collecting area. There was about 80 people, 68 attended the potluck. The Field Service gave a talk about the history of the area and gave the group a special Use Permit. The group stayed at the Lassen Creek Campground. Dick discussed the history of the permits for collecting in the area. In 1997 you could collect up to 500# at 4 dig spots. Rainbow, needles, etc. In 2015 a new permit was established which allowed collection of 100# in 2 weeks from 4 sites. There is no collecting from anywhere else. The change in frequency of collecting is due to cultural sensitivity as there is a long history of the obsidian source being used by American Indians. A collector can have 5 permits per year. The permits are free. The area is very clean, rockhounds leave no trace, the small amount of trash collected was taken to the Field Service location. The group left Alturas and went to Cedarville and south about 50 miles to Tuledad for green agate. There is easy access and camp sites. The is petrified wood in the area that was formed upright but the group did not go for them. August no reports. September no reports. Dick was not aware of any Coop trips. Due to the low participation Dick wondered there is a need to continue meeting? Someone commented that the hills are steeper now.

The Antioch Lapidary Club is planning a trip to Graveyard Point in Idaho for Plume Agate and Petrified Wood. November 9th the Rockhound Fanatics are going to Black Butt Lake. December Vallejo is going to the Mojave area for Dick announced that January is geodes. Quartzsite time and he and Betty plan on being wagonmaster for the Ye Old Timer camp area. (Out on Paloma Road, north of town.), starting on January 10th for 2 weeks. They will do local field trips. There is a local group, the Road Runners, o will lead 2 trips per day for 2 weeks. February, no plans at this time. March, no plans at this time. April, 2019 will be the next NBFT meeting. It will be on the 2nd Saturday, location to be determined.

Old Business: The group is reminded to update the roster.

New Business: The Slate was discussed. It is time to do an election for 2 Directors to replace Kelly Plumb and Steven May. Dick called for any interest in these 2 positions. None heard. Dick asked for bids for the Spring 2019 meeting. Dick said he would ask Steven May of the Santa Clara M&G to see if they will host the next meeting. They usually set it up in San Jose. The Silent Auction concluded at the end of our potluck. Dick thanked Louise Gilley for the setup of the potluck. The meeting was adjourned at 12:15 pm.


