Mackay grew up in New York City's Five Points slum ("The Gangs of New York neighborhood), came of age amid the violent mayhem of the California Gold Rush, and rose to manhood in the deep, rich, and outrageously dangerous mines of the Comstock Lode beneath Virginia City, Nevada.



On the Comstock, Mackay worked his way up from nothing, battling the pernicious "Bank Ring" of California capitalists who'd monopolized the lode, and struck the legendary Big Bonanza, a stupendously valuable body of gold and silver ore buried 1,500 feet below the center of the town. The extraordinary wealth Mackay extracted from the Comstock Lode drove wild stock market frenzies in San Francisco. When John Mackay died in 1902—with a personal fortune equivalent to about \$50 billion modern dol-

lars—front page obituaries all over Europe and the United States hailed him as one of the most admired Americans of the age.

Gregory Crouch is a writer who specializes in adventurous and historic subjects. He is the author of the Comstock epic, The Bonanza King: John Mackay and the Battle Over the Greatest Riches in the American West, the World War II flying adventure China's Wings: War, Romance, Intrigue, and Adventure in the Middle Kingdom In 1988, Gregory Crouch graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York, where he studied military history. During his active service, he completed U.S. Army Airborne and Ranger schools and led two infantry platoons.





North Bay Field Trips was founded January 5, 1974. On September 21, 2019, by vote of the Officers and Directors, it was disbanded. The end came slowly; decline in hosted field trips, low to very low attendance at our Spring and Fall meetings, culminating with not being able to get a host society and canceling our Spring 2019 meeting. The excitement for NBFT, the interest in NBFT and apparently the need for NBFT was gone.


